

Pathway Confidence is captured twice a year in every subject. The grades are colour coded, according to the key. Class teachers use knowledge of the student and student's work to indicate the likelihood of students meeting the pathway target. This can change throughout the year, and key stage, as students are expected to learn more in terms of knowing more, remembering more, and being able to do more.

Pathways are set using historical performance. Pathways are a projection of progress for GCSE of a typical student with similar historical data. They are reviewed regularly.

Active learner is an indication of the active engagement made in lessons. It is a key component of the ideal Lathom Learner profile and incorporates each student's effort, behaviour and work in the subject. It also includes factors such as engaging with recall and catching up on missed work.

Reading Age reflects a student's reading age in years and months from the last reading age test completed in school. Considering a student's age and comparing it to reading age is an indication of reading ability. Reading age intervention is in place to support students as necessary.

Curriculum Progress is monitored throughout the year. Twice a year teachers will provide an overall view of student progress through the curriculum for each subject. The stages are colour coded, according to the key. The stage indicates the student's progress in learning, retaining and using the knowledge and skills required for each subject. This can change throughout the year, and key stage, as students must continue to build on prior learning and acquire new knowledge and skills over time.

Independent learner is again a key component of the ideal Lathom Learner profile. It is an indication of how well students present the PROUD ethos within a subject. It includes factors such as homework, involvement with extra-curricular, and the development of skills for future learning.

A barrier to learning is a reason why a student is not securing the knowledge and skills required in a subject, or why their Active or Independent Learner is currently not graded as good. Barriers to learning are tracked and lead to intervention where necessary.
